

DAGNY AND SOPHUS.

We, Dagny and Sophus, were married at the First Lutheran Church, Fargo, North Dakota on Wednesday Evening, December 29, 1926, at eight o'clock by Pastor J.D. Rundsvold. Serena Winness was Maid of Honor, my sister Idun and my cousin Mildred Garvik were Bridesmaids. Ruth Reis was Flower Girl and Wilfred Aasgaard Fredrikson was Ring Bearer. Tobois Thompson was Bestman. Otto Jagd, Hartvig Fugleberg and Clarence Thykeson were Ushers. Mother gave a big wedding dinner to fifty guests at the Bluebird Cafe right after we were married. On January 3, 1927 we left for Fayetteville, Arkansas, where we made our first home. Sophus was an Instructor in the Civil Engineering Department at the State University. During the Summer of 1927 I was at Fargo, North Dakota with my folks but Sophus was studying at the University of Minnesota, Minneapolis. In the Fall of 1927 we went back to Fayetteville and stayed there until the Summer of 1928. I spent the Summer of 1928 with my folks but Sophus was studying at the Iowa State College at Ames, Iowa.

In the Fall of 1928 we moved to Dallas, Texas. Sophus was Assistant Professor of Civil Engineering at Southern Methodist University. We lived in an apartment at 5817 Hillcrest Avenue. On Sunday, Mothers Day, May 12, 1929 our first baby was born. We named him Sophus Aasgaard. He was born at Baylor Hospital, Dallas, Texas. When Sophus A. was less than three months old we bought a Chevrolet Couch and on August 2nd. we started out to spend our vacation in North Dakota. Sophus came back to Dallas the first of September but as my Mother had broken her arm that summer Sophus A. and I stayed home with her until the first of November, when we came back on the train. The second year we were in Dallas we lived in a frame duplex at 3453 Mc Farlin Boulevard. It was so nice and we were so happy there. In the Spring of 1930 we bought just the necessary furniture and moved into the unfurnished side of this duplex (3451 Mc Farlin Boulevard). In the Fall of 1930 we bought the rest of the furniture we needed and fixed up the home real pretty. We were so glad to be able to have our own things to live with and enjoy.

On Thursday, May 3, 1934 our second child was born. We named him Erik Grinde, after my Mothers Father. He was born at Baylor Hospital, Dallas, Texas.
